1 Promenade

2 Gnomus

A small gnome with grotesque deformed legs whose awkward movements are accompanied by piercing shrieks (a design for a wooden nutcracker to hang on a Christmas tree)

3 Promenade

4 Il vecchio castello

A medieval castle in front of which a troubadour sings his serenade, strumming on his lute.

5 Promenade

6 Tuileries

In the famous Parisian gardens children, accompanied by their nannies, quarrel after play.

7 Bydlo

A heavy, lumbering Polish cart with enormous wooden wheels and drawn by oxen.

8 Promenade

9 Ballet of the unhatched chicks

A picture from a scene in the ballet *Trilby* for which Hartmann had designed set and costumes.

10; Samuel Goldenberg and Schmuyle.

A striking contrast between two Polish Jews: one rich and pompous, and the other a poor, stuttering beggar.

11 Promenade

12 Limoges; the market place

where French women gossip and argue in the busy square.

13 Catacombs

Hartmann himself depicted exploring the subterranean passages of Paris by lantern light; Mussorgsky visualizes a Roman sepulchre.

**14 Promenade (cum mortuis in lingua mortua)**

Mussorgsky's note: "The creative spirit of the dead Hartmann leads me to the skulls and invokes them: the skulls glow faintly from within".

**15 Baba Yaga; the hut on fowl's legs**

A drawing of a clock in the shape of the hut inhabited by the celebrated Russian witch Baba Yaga, whom Mussorgsky portrays in flight on her iron mortar.

**16 The Great Gate of Kiev**

Hartmann's masterpiece plan for a massive city gate with a cupola shaped like a Slavonic helmet was sadly never realized. Mussorgsky completes the concept aurally with a 'great chorale' adorned by Russian orthodox chant and pealing bells.
